Publication Ethics and Publication Malpractice Statement

Author Responsibilities

1. By submitting a manuscript, the author(s) warrant that the manuscript is their own, original work and that it has neither been published previously nor is currently being considered for publication elsewhere. Submitting the same manuscript concurrently to more than one journal is unacceptable
2. Authors must notify the INI of any conflicts of interest.
3. Authors should cite publications that have been influential in determining the nature of the reported work. Plagiarism in all its forms constitutes unethical conduct and is unacceptable.
4. Author is obliged to provide proper acknowledgment of the work of others used in a research.
5. Authors must report any errors they discover in their manuscript to the INI and correct the results.
6. Authors agree to transfer the copyright to INI.
7. The corresponding author should ensure that there is a full consensus of all co-authors in approving the final version of the paper and its submission for publication. If the reviewers recommend extensive revisions, authors may be asked to revise their work and then to resubmit the article.
8. Author must not use any fabricated research data in their work, which might lead to deceived outcomes

Reviewer Responsibilities

1. Reviewers must notify the INI Publication of any conflicts of interest.
2. Reviewers must keep information pertaining to the manuscript confidential.
3. Reviewers must bring to the attention of the editor any information that may be reason to reject publication of a manuscript.
4. Reviews should be conducted objectively, and observations should be formulated clearly with supporting arguments
5. Reviewers should point out relevant published work which is not yet cited.
6. Reviewers should not consider manuscripts in which they have conflicts of interest resulting from competitive, collaborative, or other relationships or connections with any of the authors, companies, or institutions connected to the papers.
7. Peer reviewers' identities are protected as are authors.

Editorial Board Responsibilities

1. The editor and any editorial staff must maintain confidentiality and not disclose any information about a submitted manuscript to anyone other than the corresponding author, reviewers, potential reviewers, other editorial advisers, and the publisher

2. Editors must disclose any conflicts of interest.
3. The editors will evaluate manuscripts exclusively on the basis of their academic merit and fit with the journal's themes
4. Editors are responsible for making publication decisions (accept or reject) based only on the paper's importance, originality, clarity, and the study's relevance to the Conference of Inventics.
5. Editors must preserve anonymity of reviewers.
6. Editors must ensure the quality of the publish material
7. Editors should take reasonable responsive measures when ethical complaints have been presented concerning a submitted manuscript or published paper.
8. Editors must always be willing to publish corrections, clarifications, retractions and apologies when needed.
9. Editors should publish a description of peer review processes, and should be ready to justify any important deviation from the described processes.
10. Editors reserve the right to edit text for clarity, style and length of the accepted manuscripts.
11. Manuscripts will be evaluated for their content without regard to race, gender, sexual orientation, religious belief, ethnic origin, citizenship, or political philosophy.
